The Call to Discipleship

What is a Discipleship? In some denominations it's called an "Altar Call" or the "Invitation." In the PCUSA it is referred to as Self Offering or a Call to Discipleship. In Matthew 28:19, Jesus commissions his disciples, and says to them; *"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you."* As disciples or followers of Christ, we have been given a charge and a responsibility to go and make disciples. One of the ways we can do that is to issue a call to discipleship which simply means to invite visitors to become part of our congregation or to become followers of Jesus Christ.

In the PCUSA Directory of Worship (W-3.5501) Invitations to Discipleship is addressed:

“The invitation to respond to Jesus Christ should be offered frequently and regularly in the Service for the Lord’s Day.” Also in the Directory of Worship (Elements of Christian Worship; W-2.5002) is states the following; “Worship should always offer opportunities to respond to Christ’s call to become disciples by professing faith, uniting with the church, and by taking up the missions of the people of God, as well as opportunities for disciples to renew the commitment of their lives to Jesus Christ and his mission in the world. As the Holy Spirit has graced each member with particular gifts for strengthening the body of Christ for mission, so worship should provide opportunities to recognize these gifts and to offer them to serve Christ in the church and in the world.”

Moving forward, we plan to look at ways to offer opportunities for visitors to respond to Christ’s calls to become disciples within the Service of the Lord’s Day. People are waiting to be asked and so we must make the invitation.

New Form of Government

There have been changes made to the Book of Order, specifically section 1, The Form of Government. We have now a **New Form of Government (nFOG)** which was proposed at the 219th General Assembly (2010) and approved by a majority of the presbyteries and now included in the 2011/2012 Book of Order. The nFOG section of the Book of Order has been condensed and now gives presbyteries and sessions (formerly governing bodies now called Councils) a bit more latitude in making decisions regarding the governance of individual congregations. In lieu of these changes, we have been asked to update our bylaws as well as develop a manual of operations. For the next few months, the Session will be working together with members of the church to develop the manual of operations based more closely and more reflective of this particular congregation. For example, the manual will include a description of each team at Trinity United, their meeting times and the goals and objectives of the team. It will include information about membership and nomination process, ordination, etc. Planning and thinking through how and when we do things will help us to provide ministry in an orderly fashion.

There will be more information provided in the future.
